

Program Notes

Symphony No. 8 by Franz Schubert - Franz Schubert completed eight fullscale symphonies and left a nearly equal number unfinished. The B Minor Symphony was constructed between 1818 and 1825, years in which he was experiencing significant compositional and physical changes. After looking to Rossini as a model for many of his earlier orchestral works, Schubert was grappling with the influence of Beethoven, whose Seventh and Eighth Symphonies had just recently premiered. Along with symphonic sketches that exist only in piano score format and his socalled Tenth Symphony, begun in 1828 shortly before his death, there is an entire body of unfinished Schubert symphonies from which the B Minor, by far the most musically remarkable, was the very last to surface. **October by Eric Whitacre** Notes from the composer, Eric Whitacre: "October is my favorite month. Something about the crisp autumn air and subtle change in light always makes me a little sentimental, and as I started to sketch I felt that same quiet beauty in the writing. The simple, pastoral melodies and subsequent harmonies are inspired by the great English Romantics (Vaughn Williams, Elgar) as I felt that this style was also perfectly suited to capture the natural and pastoral soul of the season." Eric Whitacre didn't begin studying music until he was 18, and went on to earn his Master of Music degree at Juilliard School of Music. He quickly became a popular composer, conductor and lecturer, and many of his works have entered the standard choral and instrumental repertories. October was commissioned by a consortium of Nebraska bands and was premiered in May of 2000. In this work, the composer sought to compose music that was simple yet elegant.

Our Edwardsville High School Choir is looking forward to meeting Eric Whitacre and performing under his direction at Carnegie Hall in April 2026!

El Relicario - Jose Padilla's *El Relicario* has fiery rhythms and sweeping Spanish melodies. The piece, known as a paso doble, is traditionally used to introduce bull fighters into the arena.

Camille Hawk, President Lisa Johnson, Vice President Michele Brannan, Secretary Karie Nelson, Treasurer **Rhythm Dances** is a wild dance that includes moments of lightheartedness, unabashed lyricism, and intense rhythmic outbursts. Prepare for a musical roller coaster ride as the musical lines trot, stumble, float, run, and eventually barrel into the dynamic conclusion. American composer Brian Balmages is known today as a great performer, producer, conductor, and composer. He is currently Director of the FJH music company.

Asturias by Isaac Albeniz began as a work written for the piano. First published as a *Prelude* to Albéniz's three-movement *Chants d'Espagne* in 1892, it was posthumously re-published as part of the composer's *Suite española* just before the First World War with the title *Asturias* and the subtitle *Leyenda* (legend), under which names it is known today.

This piece has everything to do with the southern Spanish region of Andalusia. Andalusia is the cultural homeland of the flamenco tradition, an art that developed under gypsy influence to embrace a passionate amalgam of guitarplaying, singing, wailing, dancing, stomping, clapping and finger snapping.

Waltz from Masquerade Suite - Aram Khachaturian was born in 1903 to Armenian parents in Tbilisi, Republic of Georgia, where he was also raised. In Moscow in 1941, Khachaturian composed Masquerade as incidental music for a new staging of Mikhail Lermontov's 1835 four-act play, The Masquerade, at Moscow's Vakhtangov Theatre. Masquerade tells an Othello-like story about a mixup at a masked ball. It's a tragic story and that explains why there is a dark undertone to this beautiful waltz music.

Perseus by Soon Hee Newbold - Take a journey with the legendary hero Perseus as he slays the snake@haired Medusa and rescues the princess Andromeda. From the opening rhythmic figures to the soaring melodies, this piece is dynamic and stunning. The composer Soon Hee Newbold began studying piano at age five and violin at age seven. She won many prestigious competitions and performed throughout the world in venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, Wolf Trap, Aspen, and Tanglewood. She received her Bachelor of Music degree from James Madison University, where she studied film scoring, orchestration, and audio production.

Basses Loaded by Carrie Lane Gruselle-Funk, swing, and rock 'n' roll are the styles featured in this medley, which was written to inspire and showcase the bass section. While the basses show off, the other sections of the orchestra also experience the contagious rhythms and melodies as they get down and rock out.
